### Example 1

<b>Race 1</b>			
Boat 1	3:30	Won by 1 sec	<b>Null race.</b>
A, B, C, D.			
Boat 2	3:31		
E, F, G, H			

<b>Race 2</b>			
Boat 1	3:30	Won by 2 sec	<b>F beats B, 2 secs</b>
A, F, C, D.			
			Change C for G
Boat 2	3:32		
E, B, G, H			

<b>Race 3</b>			
Boat 1	3:33		<b>C beats G, 7secs</b>
A, F, G, D.			
			Change C for G
Boat 2	3:28	Won by 5 secs	Change H for D
E, B, C, H			

<b>Race 4</b>			
Boat 1	3:31		<b>D beats H 4 secs</b>
A, F, C, H			Compare to race 2
Boat 2	3:29	Won by 2 secs	
E, B, G, D			

So we have:

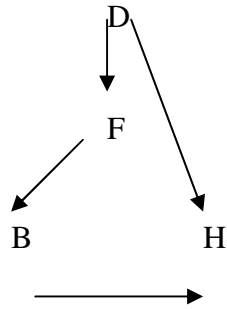
F beats B 2 secs

D beats H 4 secs.

Next set of races put F and D in 3 seat and B and H in bow seat.

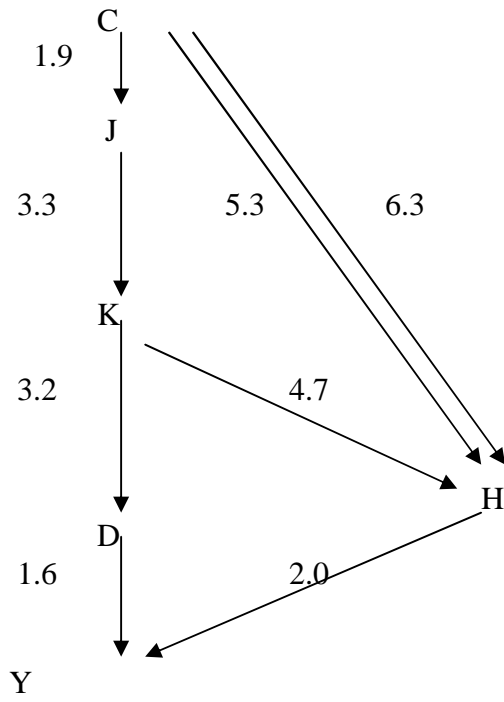
Race again and get results D beats F 2 seconds and H and B draw.
